

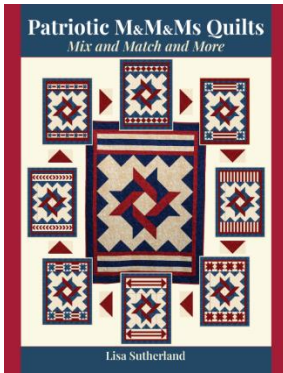


## Lewis Clark Quilts of Valor Dec. 2022

She became involved in making patriotic quilts to honor her father, husband, son, brothers, uncles, nephews, and cousins to recognize their service and honor them. The

patterns are sometimes named after who they were first made for or in honor of someone special. Ray's All-American Star was the first one she wrote and made and is in honor of her dad, Marion Ray Shurtz. He served in WWII in the Navy. She does this for the Veterans and Service members who have and still do, give up a lot to serve our country and keep us free. Her business and the website has been a labor of love and a learning experience. She keeps in mind the reason for doing this, or else she would have given up long ago. I felt I owed it to her to buy her book and it has 35 patterns in it. The book is \$29.95, available on the Quilt Jubilee website, as are her free patterns which may only be available until 12/22.
