LCQOV – OQV Top Checklist – Please use this form when turning in a top for LCQOV – the checklist is on the LCQOV website, available at sew days, and in LCQOV kits. Include your name and phone, accurate measurements of the top, and any notes at the bottom. Remember to press the top from the front—clipping any threads caught in the seams, and from the back—clipping long stitching or raveling threads. Use a lint roller to remove loose threads and pet hair. Our quilters deserve tops which are will prepped for quilting, thank you!
